All competitors must be at minimum of 21 years of age

PAIRS SKATING – One category – General. Age 21+ with no upper age limit.

EVENT 1A	Pairs	TITLE	General	The maximum time is 2:50 sec, but may be less. Couples must perform a well-balanced program that demonstrates skating skills, timing and unison, with full use of the ice surface. There are no required elements, but the programme may contain up to 8 elements selected from the following: a. A maximum of two (2) different lifts, from Group 1 or Group 2 with a minimum of ½ a revolution for the man and 1 revolution for the lady. Variations of the lady's position, no-handed and one-handed lifts, and combination lifts are not permitted. Overhead lifts and twist lifts are not permitted. A different take off counts as a different lift. b. A maximum of one (1) solo jump. Only single jumps are permitted. c. A maximum of one (1) jump combination with a maximum of three jumps included or one (1) jump sequence (the two jumps with the highest value will count for points). d. A maximum of one (1) throw jump. Only single jumps are permitted. e. A maximum of one (1) pair spin (pair spin or pair combination spin). The spin must have a required minimum number of revolutions: three (3) revolutions for a pair spin and six (6) for a pair combination spin. There must be a minimum of two (2) revolutions in each position or the position will not be counted. f. A maximum of one death spiral or pivot spiral (position optional). At least ¾ revolution in pivot position by the man is required.
				g. A maximum of one choreo-spiral sequence. To be confirmed a spiral sequence must include at least two (2) spiral positions of not less than 3 secs each or one (1) spiral position not less than 6 secs long.
				Only the first executed spiral sequence will contribute to the technical score. Additional spiral sequences will be counted as moves- in-the field (transitions) and marked as such.

FREE SKATING - 4 Categories (Pre Bronze, Bronze, Silver and Gold/Masters) with 3 age Classes within Pre Bronze, Bronze and Silver – see below. Must have minimum of 3 competitors in the event otherwise will be combined. The Gold/Masters category is 21+ with no upper age limit.

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

All technical requirements are listed as new national tests with the exception of Field Moves. Please see NISA website or charts below for equivalencies. Please note that a skater who holds the old novice test, is considered to have passed level 1 free.

RULES

The competitions will be held under NISA regulations and are open to eligible members as defined by NISA.

The Committee of Bracknell Ice Skating Club reserve the right to refuse entry without reason or to cancel a competition or combine classes because of insufficient entries.

ONLY WRITTEN APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED. Photocopies of entry forms will be accepted.

Entries will not be accepted unless all new national test levels with dates of test passes have been properly completed. For tests taken under the old structure, please see the tables of equivalences listed below.

Test standards are as at closing date. Ages are at closing date 26 March 2012.

Entries will be limited determined by the time available and a reserve list will operate up until the draw.

The draw for competitions will take place at Bracknell Ice Rink, at a time and date to be notified later.

Music on compact disc (with an additional copy) only will be accepted. THESE SHOULD BE CLEARLY MARKED with name, address and competition and handed in at the club reception table on arrival, there should be just one track recorded.

Entry fees will not be refunded for withdrawals after the closing date.

Trophies must be signed for and held at the winner's risk. They must be returned in good condition to the Trophy Secretary, Bracknell Ice Skating Club by the **23 April 2012** or on request.

Flash photography will not be permitted during warm-ups or competitions, either on the ice or at the rink side.

Video photography is allowed with the prior permission of the skaters concerned.

Age level for free skaters in class 1A is 21+ with no upper limit.

Age levels for free skaters in classes 2A – 10A are as follows. Ages are as at closing date.

Seniors	Skaters 21 – 37
Masters	Skaters aged 38- 47
Classics	Skaters aged 48 and above

Artistic Events – events 12, 13, 14– Judging is as follows:

There will be five judges each marking an individual section

Judge 1 Precision and difficulty	Difficulty of the steps and other skating movements involved, including steps, jumps, and spins, and how well they are performed. Additional marks for double or other complex jump sequences will not be given unless they greatly enhance the performance.
Judge 2 Costume and design	Suitability of the costume in relation to the music and illustration of the theme (if
	any), continuity and linking of sections within the performance.
Judge 3 Choreography and presentation	The interpretation of the music into skating movement, the interpretation of the
	rhythm and the balance of movements, steps, jumps and spins.
Judge 4 Music	Suitability of the music used in relation to the performance and the composition of the
	performance in relation to the harmony of the music.

In the event of a tie, the Precision & Difficulty Judge's place will be ignored. In the event of this being the same, the places will be tied.

Judge 5 Innovation and entertainment Originality of performance, general entertainment value, appeal of the performance.

Event 13 (small group exhibition) - £40.00. For this event each skater's name must be given with their NISA Membership Number and should be submitted on a separate sheet to accompany the entry form. Please do collect NISA numbers before sending in entries – each year, much time is wasted in chasing these!

Entries accompanied by a cheque that bounces will not be accepted until the entry fee is paid in cash together with an excess of £10 to cover charges which may be incurred.
