GENERAL NOTES CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES Saturday 2nd June 2007

The competitions will be held on THURSDAY 28th JUNE FOR CLASSES 1 TO 24 at Bracknell Ice Rink

1. Technical Requirements

- All technical requirements are listed as new standard tests with the exception of Field Moves. Please see Ice Link to ascertain the correct equivalence of old tests with new standard tests as at 1.1.02.
- Please note that a skater who holds the old novice test, is considered to have passed level 1 free.

2. Rules

- The competitions will be held under NISA regulations and are open to eligible members as defined by NISA
- The Committee of Bracknell Ice Skating Club reserve the right to refuse entry without reason or to cancel a competition or combine classes because of insufficient entries.
- ONLY WRITTEN APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED Photocopies of entry forms will be accepted.
- Entries will not be accepted unless **all new national test levels** with dates of test passes have been properly completed. For tests taken under the old structure, please see the tables of equivalences listed below.
- Test standards and ages are as at closing date.
- Entries will be limited determined by the time available and a reserve list will operate up until the draw.
- The draw for competitions will take place at Bracknell Ice Rink, at a time and date to be notified later.
- Music on mini disc or compact disc will be accepted. THESE SHOULD BE CLEARLY MARKED with name, address and
 competition and handed in at the club reception table on arrival. For any medium, there should be just one track recorded.
- Entry fees will not be refunded for withdrawals after the closing date.
- Trophies must be signed for and held at the winner's risk. They must be returned in good condition to the Trophy Secretary, Bracknell Ice Skating Club by the 1st June 2008 or on request.
- Flash photography will not be permitted during warm-ups or competitions, either on the ice or at the rink side.
- Video photography is allowed with the prior permission of the skaters concerned.
- Age levels for free skaters are as follows

Class I - SENIORS	skaters born between	July 1 st , 1971	June 30 th , 1986
Class II - MASTERS	skaters born between	July 1 st , 1951	June 30 th , 1971
Class III -CLASSICS	skaters born before	June 30 th , 1951	(no upper limit)

• Artistic classes – classes 16, 17, 18, 19, 24 – Judging is as follows:

There will be five judges each marking an individual section

Judge 1 Technical Merit

Judge 2 Artistic Impression

Judge 3 Musical Interpretation

Judge 4 Choreography

Judge 5 Costume/Props Note that this mark is for the use of the costume and props, not for the costumes and props in themselves. Each judge will also give a second mark for Entertainment value. Both sets of marks per judge will be added with the highest overall score being the winner. In the event of a tie, the Entertainment Value mark will be used as the tiebreaker.

Improvisation classes – classes 20 and 21

This category consists of a programme executed with only the elements listed in the schedule, all additional elements will be penalised. In the event of a fall, skaters will be allowed to insert that element a second time, and the second attempt will be the one that counts. Second mark has priority in the event of a tie, marking is based on the way the improvised routine interprets the music. The music chosen will be from a movie soundtrack (non-vocal). Dress code is sober and of a simple nature.

The music on which the skaters will improvise their programmes will be played approx one quarter of an hour before going on the ice. Listening time is approx 15 mins. Participants must then retire to the dressing rooms where they will no longer be able to hear the music or see other skaters on the ice. No contact with coaches is allowed during the listening and following period.

3. Entry fees

- Solo Skaters Competitions 3 to 15 (free), Classes 16, 17 and 18 (Artistic), Classes 20 and 21 (improvisation) ALL £18.00
- Class 1 and 2 couples and pairs £20.00
- Class 19 (small group artistic) and Class 24 (show number) £5.00 per skater (minimum £20) for these classes each skaters name must be given with their NISA Membership Number and should be submitted on a separate sheet to accompany the entry form. Please do collect NISA numbers before sending in entries each year, much time is wasted in chasing these!
- Please forward a separate cheque and entry form for each competition entered. Entries accompanied by a cheque that bounces
 will not be accepted until the entry fee is paid in cash together with an excess of £10 to cover charges which may be incurred.
